Unwelcome Behaviour

It is unacceptable for you to:

- Disturb the learning of others
- Be disrespectful or speak inappropriately
- Use rude language or swear, including online
- Use aggressive and physical behaviours towards others
- Be dishonest
- Bully others, including online
- Leave the classroom without permission
- Not follow adult instructions or requests
- Damage equipment or purposely use it in the wrong way.

The Four Stages of Behaviour

On the other side of this sheet are the 4 stages of behaviour and examples of the consequences for each stage of behaviour.

Behaviour	Examples	Action
Green Behaviour	You feel happy, safe and ready to learn.	You are showing our school values and expectations- you should be proud of yourself! Stickers 'Well done' 'Thank you' Certificates Star of the week Show Mrs Leonard your work Thumbs up Green points on Trackit Lights
Amber Behaviour	Not following Class Charter. You might be: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Stopping others from learning or playing. • Not completing work. • Upsetting others. • Not telling the truth. • • Not using equipment properly. 	We will offer you: Reminders about our school values and class charter. A chance to change your behaviour. We will try to help you make the right choice. Your teacher will talk to you about this behaviour. Your teacher might move you to another place in the classroom. If you choose to continue with amber behaviours, this will be classed as yellow behaviour.
Yellow Behaviour	Not displaying School Values <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Many amber behaviours • You walk out of class without permission because you're angry or upset • You keep on stopping others learning. • Damage to school equipment/theft. • Use of rude language. • Pushing and shoving during a game. • Rough play. • Being unkind to others on purpose (not respecting protected characteristics). • Refusal to do what is asked. 	You will miss some of your break or lunchtime (e.g., in the classroom or another room.) You may be instructed to complete the work you have missed, pick up items that have been thrown etc. You may be asked to leave your classroom. Mrs Leonard and your parents/carers will be informed about your behaviour. You will be expected to talk about your behaviour with other adults in the school. If you display many yellow behaviours, this will be classed as red behaviour.
Red Behaviour	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Many yellow behaviours. • Bullying • Aggressive swearing at people including racial and homophobic language • Hurting others on purpose • Running away. • Theft of significant items. • You have or use a weapon • Serious damage to school equipment/ property • Fighting 	This is serious. Your parents/carers will be called in for a meeting with your teacher and Mrs Leonard. You may be asked to complete your work in other parts of the school. We might write a behaviour support plan to help you. Mrs Leonard may decide that your behaviour is not safe, and you may not be able to attend school for a while.
